#### Luxury: Treasure of the Roman Empire

The elite class of the Roman Empire used luxury goods to convey their status in Roman society. The material, craftsmanship and subjects depicted communicated the wealth, sophistication and power of the owner. In 1831 a collection of over 50 pounds of silver objects was discovered by a farmer in Berthouville, a village in Northwestern France. Known as the Berthouville treasure, this collection of Roman luxury goods was originally dedicated to the god Mercury at a sanctuary in Berthouville. In this bibliography, we have included titles about the Berthouville Treasure and other Roman treasures, as well as general works on Roman luxury items. Also listed are books about Roman silver, glass, jewelry and gems, and titles exploring the history of this ancient culture.
