Elephants, ca. 1917, By Wilhelm Kuhnert (German, 1865-1926)

The 20th century wildlife paintings of the group of painters today known as the Big Four: Wilhelm Kuhnert, Richard Friese, Bruno Liljefors and Carl Rungius broke with past tradition, presenting a new image of wildlife that emphasized the animal and its natural behavior and habitat. In this bibliography, we include titles about each of the artists of the Big Four, as well as titles that explore the impact of Charles Darwin's revolutionary theory of evolution on the visual arts, and titles about the additional artists included in the exhibition. Works about wildlife art in general, and the conservation of nature in art have been included as well.
